**INSTRUCTION TO MARKERS**

- 1) Candidates are required to answer ALL the questions.
- 2) This memorandum serves as a guide to markers. Some responses may require a marker's discretion.
- 3) Candidates' responses should be assessed as objectively as possible.

**MARKING THE COMPREHENSION**

- Because the focus is on understanding, incorrect spelling and language errors in responses should not be penalized unless such errors change the meaning/understanding. (Errors must still be indicated.)
- If a candidate uses words from a language other than the one being examined, disregard those words, and if the answers still make sense, do not penalize. However, if a word from another language is used in a text and required in an answer, this will be acceptable.
- For **open-ended questions**, no marks should be awarded for YES/NO or I AGREE/I DISAGREE. The reason/substantiation/motivation is what should be considered.
- When one-word answers are required and the candidate gives a whole sentence, mark correct **provided** that the correct word is underlined/highlighted.
- When two/three facts/points are required and a range is given, mark **only** the first two/three.
- Accept dialectical variations.
- For multiple-choice questions, accept BOTH the letter corresponding with the correct answer AND/OR the answer written out in full.

**NOTE:** Accept other suitable responses, provided that they are grounded in the text. A candidate can score ONE mark for an answer not well substantiated.

- 1.7.1 He/ she was scratching his/her head. ✓✓ (2)
- 1.7.2 She giggled. ✓ (1)
- 1.7.3 The jogger does not understand how the lady's small effort could make a difference as she is saving only a few turtles. The elderly lady feels that she is making a difference in the world the turtles are living in, thus contributing to saving the world at large. ✓✓✓ (3)



- 1.8.1 You can change the world by performing good deeds./  
Good deeds can make a difference to change the world. ✓✓ (2)

**NOTE:** Accept other relevant summaries.

Allocate marks as follow:

ONE mark if the moral of the story was correctly summarized.

ONE mark if the learner stick to the word count in the instruction.

- 1.9 **NOTE:**This is an open-ended answer. Accept a suitable response,  
provided it is grounded in TEXT A. A candidate can score ONE  
mark for an answer not well substantiated. (3)

- 1.10 By biting/ eating something, you are actually destroying it. The headline  
suggests that you can save the planet by eating it. ✓✓ (2)

- 1.11 He has a PH.D degree, suggesting that he is an expert. ✓  
He is described as a best-selling author. ✓  
He is described as an award-winning documentarian. ✓ (2)

**NOTE:** Accept any TWO of the above.

- 1.12 Yes  
If you are a vegan and do not eat animals or animal products, you will  
contribute to saving certain species. / You will prevent cruelty to animals  
that are killed for their meat or bred for their products like milk and eggs.  
✓✓

**OR**

- No  
Certain animals are bred for consumption or for the use of their products  
and by consuming it, it will not make any difference to the survival of the  
earth. ✓✓ (2)

**NOTE:** This is an open-ended answer. Accept a suitable response,  
provided it is grounded in TEXT B. A candidate can score ONE  
mark for an answer not well substantiated.

**SECTION B: SUMMARY****QUESTION 2**

The following points form the answer to the question:

<b>QUOTATIONS</b>		<b>FACTS</b>	
1	“ Use cash for non-bill spending ...”	1	Use cash to prevent you from overspending.
2	“Put your cash in envelopes each month and mark them clearly for their purposes.”	2	Allocate money to cover specific expenses to prevent you from spending it on unplanned purchases.
3	“... start by putting R50-R100 away every week.”	3	Save small amounts of money on a weekly basis.
4	“Do not get catalogues or emailed announcements from companies trying to sell you stuff.”	4	Do not react to advertisements from companies to prevent yourself from buying unnecessary items.

**MARKING THE SUMMARY**

Marking is on the basis of the inclusion of valid material and the exclusion of invalid material.

The summary should be marked as follows:

- \* Mark allocation:
  - 7 marks for 7 points (1 mark per main point).
  - 3 marks for language.
  - Total marks: 10
- \* Distribution of language marks when candidate has not quoted verbatim:
  - 1-3 points correct: award 1 mark
  - 4-5 points correct: award 2 marks
  - 6-7 points correct: award 3 marks

\* **Distribution of language marks when candidate has quoted verbatim:**

- 6-7 quotes: award no language mark
- 1-5 quotes: award 1 language mark

\* **Word count:**

- Markers are required to verify the number of words used.
- Do not deduct any marks if the candidate fails to indicate the number of words used, or if the number of words used is indicated incorrectly.
- If the word limit is exceeded, read up to the last sentence above the stipulated upper limit and ignore the rest of the summary.

**TOTAL SECTION B: 10****SECTION C: LANGUAGE****NOTE**

- One-word answers must be marked correct, even if the **spelling** is incorrect, unless the error changes the meaning of the word.
- In full-sentence answers, incorrect spelling should be penalized if the error is in the language structure being tested.
- Sentence structures must be grammatically correct and given in full sentences/as per instruction.
- For multiple-choice questions, accept BOTH the letter corresponding with the correct answer AND/OR the answer written out in full as correct.
